RAIN DOESN'T DAMPEN JOY AT 52ND ANNUAL COMMENCEMENT

MCCC's Commencement Ceremony on May 17 was briefly interrupted by a sudden thunderstorm. But a little rain could not diminish the milestone moment for the graduates of the Class of 2019. The guest speaker for the big day was Mercer County Undersheriff Pedro Medina, an MCCC alumnus. Student speaker was Samantha Costa, a Paralegal graduate who is already on the job for the New Jersey Office of the Public Guardian. Professor of Biology Dr. Ron Smith was the recipient of the annual Distinguished Teaching Award.

THANK YOU, PHI THETA KAPPA!

When student leaders work alongside staff members, good things happen. Mercer's five-star Phi Theta Kappa chapter helped the college reach out to students about Gov. Murphy's new free tuition program for community college students, the Community College Opportunity Grant program. Chapter officers recruited volunteers to distribute flyers, post to social media, share their message at faculty meetings and in their classes, and staff a table in the Student Center. They were similarly active in the community. Thanks in part to their efforts, 204 students received CCOG to cover tuition costs for spring semester.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT LEADS THE WAY

MCCC's Student Government Association (SGA) is the best proof that life at MCCC is all about community. This year, 7,500 students dedicated themselves to enhancing life for the entire student body through their participation in SGA, Student Life, and college club activities. They hosted 224 events, including a fundraiser for Alex's Lemonade Stand for childhood cancer research, raising nearly \$1,500 – bringing the six-year total to nearly \$9,500 for this worthwhile charity. Students also hosted a "Blingo Bingo" event, drawing 71 participants and raising \$895 for Womanspace in honor of Women's History Month, with a matching donation of \$895 to the Lymphoma Foundation.



NURSING PROGRAM ADDS 74 NIGHTINGALES TO THE HEALTHCARE FIELD

MCCC's most popular major had a stellar year, as the college graduated 74 students from the Nursing program. Supporting students throughout this rigorous curriculum were peer tutors in the Nursing Learning Center, plus instructors in Science Learning Centers on both campuses. Additionally, Nursing students were able to reach out to a success coach dedicated to the program. In recent years, the pass rate on the national licensure exam (NCLEX) for MCCC graduates has topped 90 percent on the first try. (The national average is around 85 percent.) Nursing alumni are employed by healthcare facilities throughout the region, many in managerial roles.

BUSINESS STUDENTS TAKE FIRST AT RU COMPETITION, SECOND AT DATAFEST

In the college's second most popular major, Business Administration, students proved they could get the job done. Utilizing a shared leadership strategy that allowed for both creativity and practical solutions, a team of six students took first place out of six community colleges at the 2019 New Jersey County College Case Competition at Rutgers Business School. In a second competition, Business students computed, analyzed and collaborated their way to second place during DataFest 2019, held at Rider University. The mighty Mercer team faced off against nine four-year colleges in the weekend-long event.

RADIO STUDENTS ARE VOICE OF MERCER

Radio listeners, especially those who tune in to WPST (94.5 FM), may have heard commercials with this sign-off: "This commercial was produced by Mercer students." Two years ago, the MCCC Marketing Department teamed up with the college's Radio program to give students an opportunity to work on a real-world assignment – to give the college a more authentic message for student recruitment. Since the initiative began, the college has used more than a dozen commercials written, produced and voiced by Mercer students.





GLOBAL VIEWS: STUDY TOURS TO IRELAND AND POLAND

The Global Opportunities (GO) Center hosted two Study Tours this year for more than 50 students and their instructors. Health Professions students traveled to Ireland, where they learned about history, culture and healthcare. A trip to Poland focused on the Holocaust; students returned with powerful insights.



THE COLLEGE VOICE'S AWARD-WINNING YEAR

It was an outstanding year in journalism at MCCC, as the college's student newspaper, *The College VOICE*, delivered once again with seven issues from September through May, available in print and archived online. After receiving three finalist awards from the Society of Professional Journalists in early March, *VOICE* staffers won 18 awards from the New Jersey Collegiate Press Association, including General Excellence and Best Overall Website.

CERAMICS AND SOUP FOR TASK

The Visual Arts Club and Hospitality Club teamed up for a delicious lunchtime fundraiser for the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen (TASK) in December. Approximately 20 ceramicists worked throughout the fall to produce 150 bowls and mugs in a variety of colors, shapes and sizes. On the day of the fundraiser, culinary students joined in, preparing soup to fill the bowls and hot chocolate to fill the mugs. More than \$500 was raised.



HORTICULTURE STUDENTS BLOSSOM AT PHILADELPHIA FLOWER SHOW

A display themed "The Power of a Rooftop Oasis" was MCCC's 2019 entry for the Philadelphia Flower Show. Boasting an impressive facsimile of the Trenton Makes Bridge, the rooftop garden display was set against a downtown Trenton backdrop, earning the exhibit a Silver Award in the prestigious show's Educational Category.

VIKINGS TEAMS CONTINUE TO ADD TO RICH SPORTS LEGACY

For the first time in college history, MCCC fielded a men's lacrosse team. The season was a rousing success, with the Vikings securing a berth in the national tournament. Five players earned All-Region honors and Brady Moore was Region 19's Player of the Year. Men's and women's tennis also made appearances at their national tournaments, while baseball and men's soccer narrowly missed out on capturing regional titles. Mercer athletes excelled in the classroom as well. More than 40 athletes will transfer to four-year schools in the fall, many with athletic scholarships.



MCCC WELCOMES STUDENTS UNDER NEW JERSEY GRANT PROGRAM

Following the passage of New Jersey's Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) program, MCCC focused on getting the word out last fall about this groundbreaking initiative. CCOG's pilot semester was a resounding success, providing free tuition to approximately 200 eligible students, many of whom could not have attended college otherwise.



START AT MERCER, GO ANYWHERE!

For students intent on transfer after MCCC, the possibilities continued to grow this year. In the fall, the college signed an agreement with Rider University that added 15 majors to the guaranteed transfer list. In January, the college signed a Transfer Pathways agreement for dual admission with Stockton University and, in April, signed with Drexel University Online to provide discounts of up to 40 percent for Drexel's online courses. These discounts can be applied toward bachelor's, master's, and doctorate degrees, as well as certificate programs on the graduate and undergraduate levels and are open to Mercer students, alumni and staff.



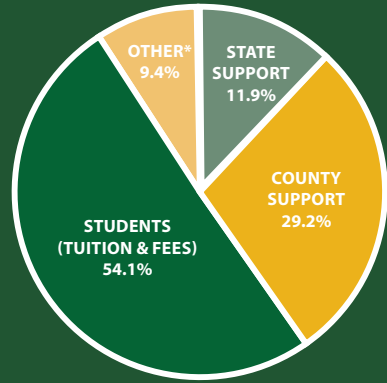
BUILDING FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

Two major construction projects began this year. The college broke ground on a building for the University Center at Mercer, which will serve as the headquarters for all five of the college's four-year partners. (The expected completion date is late Spring 2020.) Another project planned this year was the One-Stop Center, where all services related to admissions, enrollment and payment will be located. The new one-stop center will open in early Fall 2020.



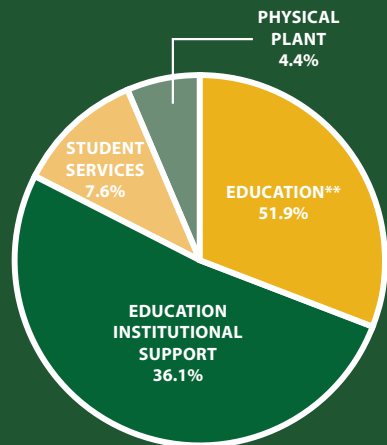
REVENUE

SCHOLARSHIP GALA



Guests in fedora hats, white suits, and floral dresses set the tone for “A Night in Old Havana,” the theme for the MCCC Foundation’s 30th annual “Spring Into Student Success” (SISS) gala. The event is the Foundation’s signature fundraiser to benefit student scholarships.

More than 200 guests helped the college raise a record-breaking \$130,000 to expand scholarship opportunities. Co-Chairs were Pasquale Colavita Jr., Nina D. Melker of Berkshire Bank, and Peggy Lucolino of PNC Bank, who led the event with Foundation Board Chair Lori Danko.

The Foundation honored three community partners. Receiving this year’s Spirit of Education Award was Infinity Flight Group and Piedmont Airlines; NJM Insurance Group received the Distinguished Benefactor Award; and the Distinguished Corporate Partner Award was presented to Wells Fargo.

A special highlight of the evening was the induction of MCCC’s very first professor emeritus, Dr. Yong Sup (Sam) Sim, as a director emeritus of the Foundation Board.

ANNUAL GOLF CLASSIC



The MCCC Foundation and the Athletics Department teamed up once again to welcome 100 community friends and corporate supporters to the MCCC Golf Classic in partnership with Haldeman Auto Group, held at Trenton Country Club Oct. 1. The 27th annual tournament, which benefits the college’s student athletes, raised a record-breaking \$35,000 in scholarship support. The tournament is held in memory of Dr. Cynthia Schaffer, who served as a member of the MCCC Foundation Board and was an avid supporter of youth sports.

Following the day on the links, golfers joined with other dinner guests in the club’s ballroom for a festive awards reception and buffet. The evening celebration included a silent auction featuring rounds of golf at some of the region’s premier courses and other items donated by donors and friends.

Student athletes from numerous Mercer teams came out to thank participants for investing in their futures. Last year, tournament proceeds enabled the Foundation to award scholarships to 17 students.

‘WORLD AWAITS’ AT SCHOLARSHIP RECEPTION

With the theme “The World Awaits You” reflecting the possibilities ahead, the MCCC Foundation brought together grateful students and their donors for the annual MCCC Honors Recognition Reception Oct. 10 at Mercer Oaks. Each table featured a “passport” story about a successful MCCC alumnus.

The college recognized over 200 scholarship recipients who have distinguished themselves academically and as active members of the MCCC community. Scholarship recipients are from practically every discipline of study at the college and include entering freshmen, continuing students, and those preparing to graduate who will use the funds at their transfer schools.



GRADS REWARDED AT HONORS CONVOCATION

MCCC recognized and rewarded academic excellence during its 2019 Honors Convocation on May 17. Held in Kelsey Theatre just hours before the college’s Commencement, students received certificates and scholarships to recognize their achievements.

Numerous graduating students received scholarships to continue their education, with some top scholars receiving multiple awards. Student athletes were also recognized with scholarships for academic achievement.



CORPORATE GIVING HIGHLIGHTS

NEW JERSEY MANUFACTURERS

New Jersey Manufacturers (NJM) completed a three-year pledge, adding up to \$125,000, this year. With this funding, the college has been able to finish a major expansion project at Trenton Hall, which houses the James Kerney Campus Gallery, a community room, an outdoor courtyard, and programs in Fashion Design, Security Systems Technology, Cybersecurity, and Health Professions.



WELLS FARGO

Wells Fargo continued to fund the Wells Fargo Urban Scholarship Fund this year. Since its establishment in 2014, the fund has awarded tuition dollars to nearly 40 students from Trenton area schools, some of whom have no other access to funding.



BRISTOL-MYERS SQUIBB

This \$25,000 grant will be used to enhance the laboratory curriculum for Anatomy and Physiology students at both campuses. It provides for new physiology equipment and software that will benefit students studying science, especially those in MCCC's Health Professions programs.



JANSSEN PHARMACEUTICALS

Trenton-area students looking to pursue a career as a Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) will now have access to the tools of the trade, thanks to a \$15,000 grant from Janssen Pharmaceuticals. The funds will be used to double the capacity at a new CNA training lab at 101 North Broad Street on the James Kerney Campus. Through partnership with the Trenton School District, students will be utilizing the facilities for training as CNAs.



MAJOR COLLEGE GRANTS

TITLE III

This grant helped Mercer to improve efficiency and initiate programs to expand its service to low-income students by providing funds to improve and strengthen the academic quality, institutional management, and fiscal stability. Projects included a new contact center to improve customer service, improved process to address financial aid queries and continued funding for success coaching.



MERCER COUNTY CULTURAL AND HERITAGE COMMISSION

The commission renewed its support of a variety of cultural programs at Mercer including the Gallery, Kelsey Theatre, Tomato Patch Visual and Performing Arts Workshops, Mercer Dance Ensemble, *Kelsey Review* and the Mercer County Symphonic Band.



NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION S-STEM GRANT

Now in the fourth of a five-year grant, major scholarships were awarded to 35 students studying science, technology, engineering and mathematics, enriching classroom learning with mentoring, monthly career-building sessions, and meetings with industry professionals.



INDIVIDUAL GIVING HIGHLIGHTS

Among those generous donors promoting a culture, and legacy, of giving were Board of Trustee member Lawrence Nespoli. In addition to a \$5,000 gift to the MCCC Foundation for scholarships, Nespoli has committed an estate gift of \$25,000.

Nespoli joins a growing number of contributors to the MCCC Foundation, which has seen its endowment grow to nearly \$12 million, up by more than 35 percent in the past five years.
