Minutes of the 701<sup>st</sup> Meeting of the Board of Trustees June 29, 2023

#### E. ADAMS, GUTIERREZ & LATTIBOUDERE, LLC AMENDMENT FOR COST

WHEREAS, Mercer County Community College has a need to acquire legal services in fiscal year 2023; and

WHEREAS, the purchase will be executed as a Political Contribution Disclosure contract pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4; and

WHEREAS, the purchasing agent has determined and certified in writing that the value of this service will exceed \$17,500; and

WHEREAS, a provision of the County Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.5, (a) (1) exempts professional services from public advertising for bids but requires a resolution authorizing the award of such a contract; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the President is authorized, on behalf of this Board, to issue payments to Adams, Gutierrez and Lattiboudere, LLC of Iselin, New Jersey, for legal services for an additional \$50,000 above the initial fiscal year 2023 retainer amount of \$125,000 (as approved by the Board on June 16, 2022), for a new not to exceed amount

of \$175,000, from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 (FY 2023).

### F. <u>CANTEEN/COMPASS GROUP, U.S.A., FOOD SERVICE MANAGEMENT AND VENDING</u> SERVICES AMENDMENT FOR COST

WHEREAS, Mercer County Community College is under contract with Canteen/Compass Group, U.S.A. to operate a Hybrid Café/Market and provide catering and vending services College-wide, for students, faculty and staff for FY 2023; and

WHEREAS, catering services provided by Canteen/Compass Group, U.S.A. for both James Kerney and West Windsor campuses have increased this year to levels higher than originally projected for FY 2023, requiring the current fiscal year not to exceed spending amount to be increased accordingly; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the President is authorized, on behalf of this Board to increase the FY 2023 spending amount, pursuant to the current contract with Canteen/Compass Group, U.S.A. of Charlotte, North Carolina, by \$60,000, from \$115,000 to a new, not to exceed amount of \$175,000, due to a higher volume of catering purchase orders, for the period August 1, 2022 to July 31, 2023.

#### G. ELIZABETHTOWN WATER COMPANY

WHEREAS, Mercer County Community College has a need to test, repair, and replace fire extinguisher, suppression and sprinkler equipment in order to meet the code compliance requirements at the James Kerney and West Windsor campuses, commencing in FY 2023; and

WHEREAS, a provision of the County College Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.9, exempts the purchase of any materials, supplies, goods, services or equipment, pursuant to a contract for such equipment entered into on behalf of the State of New Jersey by the Division of Purchase and Property\*, from public advertising from bids but requires a resolution authorizing the award of such a contract; and

WHEREAS, a provision of the County Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.10, specifically provides for the purchase of work, materials and supplies by Cooperative Agreement

BE IT RESOLVED, that the President is authorized, on behalf of the Board, to enter into a contract with Fyr-Fyter Sales and Service of Pennington, New Jersey to test, repair and replace fire extinguisher, suppression and sprinkler equipment in order to meet the code compliance requirements at the James Kerney and West Windsor campuses at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.

WHEREAS, CBIZ Inc., has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that CBIZ Inc. has not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in Mercer County in the previous one year, and the contract will prohibit this vendor from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the President be authorized, on behalf of this Board, to enter into agreements with CBIZ Inc. of Cleveland, Ohio to acquire athletic, commercial, cyber, excess and liability, property, school leaders and student insurance coverage for the period from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 for an amount not to exceed \$765,000. 1976 Law the Cunningham/ Ruiz Bill

In accordance with S-485/A-1976 law the Cunningham/ Ruiz Bill requiring presidents of public institution of higher education to regularly report on-campus criminal and fire events to the institution's governing board please accept the following information:

For the calendar month of May 2023, there were two (2) reported Clery offenses or occurrences reported through College Safety and Security. The incidents are as follows-

#### 1) West Windsor Campus- Terroristic Threats:

On May 02, 2023, a student engaged in email contacts with others students and shared posts that were generally violent in nature and ostensive threatening regarding the student's "alleged" involvement as a member /associate with Central and South American based cartels.

The threat was investigated by MCCC College Safety Officers, the West Windsor Police and the Mercer County Prosecutor. In the end, it was deemed "a matter of concern" but not a threat that was actionable by law enforcement. The student was addressed by our College Safety leadership team with assistance from Dr. Simmons. The students who received the email(s) were interviewed and provided with continued support and access to counseling services.

The student who authored the inappropriate messages was then directed off campus and advised not to return until written permission is given. Provisions were made for this student to complete the semester without having to physically attend class/campus. The student fully complied.

No criminal charges at this time -The student will be subjected to a more comprehensive assessment with a determination made before the student returns to the MCCC campus/academic venues.

#### 2) James Kerney Campus- Suspicious Fire:

On May 19, a suspicious fire was reported. MCCC staff and the Trenton Fire Company were detailed to extinguish the smoldering embers. The responding Fire personnel examined the cause, origin and extent of the fire and ruled it to be the result of a careless/negligent act (possible discarded cigarette on a mulch/leave pile).

There was no measurable damage or loss/injury associated with this incident.
