Minutes of the 670th Meeting of the Board of Trustees March 9, 2021

The public meeting was called to order by Chair Mark Matzen, at 5:30 p.m., via Zoom Conferencing. I. OPENING OF MEETING

A) FLAG SALUTE

Chair Matzen led those attending the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.
