TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE and MERCER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This agreement between Mercer County Community College (MCCC) and Bloomfield College connects students in the MCCC Associate in Applied Science Degree in Accounting to the B.S. degree in Accounting or the B.S./M.S. degree in Accounting at Bloomfield College. These connected degree programs enable students to complete their associate degree and then transfer seamlessly to Bloomfield College.


1. Subject to the following provisions, all students who complete the AAS degree in Accounting at Mercer County Community College will be granted admission to Bloomfield College upon proper application.
2. Students applying for the B.S. in Accounting must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher on a scale of 4.0.
3. Students applying for the B.S./M.S. in Accounting must have
 - a. a grade cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a scale of 4.0;
 - b. a grade point average in the major of 3.0 or higher on a scale of 4.0;
 - c. completed ACC 202 Intermediate Accounting II with a grade of B or better.
4. Students might lose credit for:
 - ◆ Courses with a grade below a C
 - ◆ Mathematics courses not equivalent to courses offered for General Education credit at Bloomfield College (MTH 130 Transition to Collegiate Mathematics, MTH 160/161 Precalculus)
 - ◆ Credit earned by exam
 - ◆ Internship credit
 - ◆ Portfolio Learning Assessment credit
 - ◆ Other courses not offered for degree credit at Bloomfield College
4. Grades accepted in the major are subject to a minimum grade requirement for graduation. Students must achieve a grade point average of 2.0 or better in major required courses, with no more than two of these grades in the range of C – to D-.
5. Under this agreement class standing is predicated upon the number of credits accepted.

6. Students must fulfill the same requirements for the BS degree or BS/MS degree as specified in the Bloomfield College regulations at the time of their admission, including General Education, major requirements, and electives.
7. Credit toward the Bloomfield College General Education and elective requirements will be determined by the listing of course equivalencies in NJ Transfer (see attachment). Students may receive between 6-9 credits towards General Education requirements depending upon which courses are taken at Mercer County Community College.
8. Students who have completed the AAS in Accounting at Mercer County Community College and enroll in the BS in Accounting degree program will have the following major requirements (8.0 course units (cus)/32 credits) remaining to take at Bloomfield College:
 - ◆ ACC 318 / Taxation I (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ACC 404 / Advanced Accounting (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 200 / Introduction to Management (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 312 / Managerial Finance (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 314 / Principles of Marketing (1.0 cus / 4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 401 / Business Policy (1.0 cus / 4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 332 / International Financial Management OR ECN 309 / Money & Banking
 - ◆ MTH 200 / Applied Statistics I
9. Students who have completed the AAS in Accounting at Mercer County Community College and enroll in the BS/MS in Accounting degree program will have the following major requirements to take at Bloomfield College (16.0 cus / 64 credits) to earn the MS in Accounting:
 - ◆ ACC 318 / Taxation I (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ACC 404 / Advanced Accounting (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 200 / Introduction to Management (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 314 / Principles of Marketing (1.0 cus / 4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 401 / Business Policy (1.0 cus / 4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 332 / International Financial Management OR ECN 309 / Money & Banking
 - ◆ MTH 200 / Applied Statistics I (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ACC 505 / Advanced Taxation (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ACC 510 / Advanced Auditing (1.0 cus/4 credits) (doublecounts for ACC 421)
 - ◆ ACC 515 / Managerial Accounting Seminar (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ACC 520 / Financial Accounting Seminar (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ACC 525 / Selected Topics (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ BUS 505 / Corporate Financial Management (1.0 cus/4 credits) (doublecounts for BUS 312)
 - ◆ BUS 510 / The Legal Environment (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ECN 505 / International Economics (1.0 cus/4 credits)
 - ◆ ECN 510 / Economic Statistics
10. Students must complete a minimum of 8 course units/32 credits at Bloomfield College to meet the Bloomfield College residency requirements for undergraduate students.

11. Any modifications to the curriculum or course equivalencies are subject to approval of the chief academic officers of both Mercer County Community College and Bloomfield College.
12. Students who complete the A.A.S. in Accounting at MCCC and transfer into the B.S. in Accounting or B.S./M.S. in Accounting programs under this articulation agreement would receive a 40% tuition discount on undergraduate courses through completion of the B.S. degree and be evaluated for additional scholarships based on academic merit.
13. Each institution will inform the other in a timely manner of proposed and affected modifications of programs covered in this agreement.
14. This Agreement will remain in effect from September 1, 2017, through August 31, 2022, or until modification by mutual consent or terminated with appropriate written notice by either party due to program alterations.




