



Mercer County Community College and La Salle University Dual Admission Agreement

Mercer County Community College (MCCC) and La Salle University enter into this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from Mercer County Community College to La Salle University for the purpose of entering a bachelor's degree program.

Subject to the terms of this agreement, a student who completes one of the designated associate degree programs listed below at MCCC with the required grade point average, will be granted admission to La Salle University. These students may complete the requirements for the bachelor's degree program within two years, although certain majors may require more than 20 courses

The following associate degree programs at Mercer County Community College are designated as part of the Dual Admission Agreement:

- Business Administration
- Computer Science
- Criminal Justice
- Liberal Arts
- Biology

***Students must be enrolled in one of these programs to be eligible for this Agreement. Additional majors at MCCC have not yet been approved for the Dual Admission Agreement.

To be eligible to take advantage of this agreement, the following conditions must be met:

- Students must complete the dual admission application form at any time prior to earning 45 college level credits.
- Students must graduate from MCCC with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5.
- Students must achieve a 'C' in all courses transferred into the proposed major at La Salle. Passing grades lower that a 'C' in CORE courses, meaning courses outside of the major, will be transferable, providing that the student graduates with a 2.5 cumulative grade point average
- All students are required to obtain their associate's degree from MCCC to be eligible.

- All Dual Admission forms must be sent with a copy of the student's transcript for our review.
- > Students may transfer in as many as 70 credits to La Salle with the understanding that certain courses may be used as electives and will not be used as major courses.
- ➤ Under this agreement, La Salle University's CORE will essentially be fulfilled by the degree requirements at Mercer County Community College. However, students who graduate within the designated associate degree program may be required to complete additional CORE "qualifiers". For most programs, this requirement is (1) religion course and (1) philosophy course. These courses can be completed as part of the degree requirements at MCCC or must be taken at La Salle University.

Scholarship Information

- A Founder's Scholarship for students enrolling into full-time day programs offered at La Salle University's Main Campus will be awarded to any student with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and above. The scholarship amounts will vary between \$6,000 and \$15,000 depending on the GPA earned. All scholarship awards are subject to the University's discretion and may change.
 - \circ 2.5-2.74 = \$6,000
 - \circ 2.75-3.19 = \$8,000
 - \circ 3.2-3.49 = \$12,000
 - \circ 3.5-4.0 = \$15,000

If any of the above terms are not met, the student will be taken out of the Dual Admission Agreement and La Salle University shall determine appropriate transfer of credit and admission on an individual course basis.

Mercer County Community College and La Salle University will assure that appropriate personnel in their respective colleges are aware of this Agreement and will support it.

This agreement will automatically renew unless personnel from Mercer County Community College and La Salle University determine that a meeting is necessary to review and/or amend this Agreement. Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice of at least one (1) year in advance of the effective date of termination.

La Salle University will provide opportunities for meetings with students on the Mercer County Community College campus to provide information and assistance in matriculating to La Salle University.

Faculty, staff, and administration of both colleges are encouraged to visit the campus of each institution. The Office of Admission will supply Mercer County Community College with promotional literature, which will be used to assist students.
