#### Unit I Tort Law Essentials

Learning Objectives [Supports SLO # 1, 3]

### The student will be able to...

- Discuss the United States legal system, sources of law and the historical foundations of tort law.
- Discuss the main categories and common torts, including intentional torts, business torts and privacy torts.
- Explain general concepts in civil litigation, including legal support work and responsibilities to the client.
- Explain the foundational relationship between torts, negligence and civil litigation.
- Explain the role of lawyers and paralegals in representing tort and negligence cases.
- Distinguish the standard of proof for torts cases (preponderance of the evidence) in comparison to criminal cases (beyond a reasonable doubt).

# **Unit II Special Topics within Tort Law**

Learning Objectives [Supports SLO # 2, 3, 5]

### The student will be able to...

- Analyze case law concerning torts in a variety of jurisdictions.
- Evaluate the debate on tort reform and recovery limits for damages.
- Identify prevailing trends in tort law, including advocacy for victims of torts and negligence.

- Evaluate rules concerning insurance law for tort liability
- Distinguish between intentional torts and negligence
- Analyze hypothetical scenarios concerning tort law and apply key concepts to fact patterns.
- Discuss toxic torts in relation to victims' rights and environmental law.
- Discuss and analyze prominent cases or class action suits which may include the tobacco litigation cases, abuse and harassment cases, asbestos litigation or medical device cases.

## **Unit III Negligence**

**Learning Objectives** [Supports SLO # 2, 4, 5]

## The student will be able to...

- Identify the elements of negligence.
- Distinguish between criminal acts and negligence and explain how one incident can give rise to both civil and criminal concepts.
- Explain the standards for assessing duty of care in a negligence matter.
- Explain breach of duty and how causation of injury may be established.
- Describe the role of discovery and evidence in investigating and pursuing torts claims.
- Define special topics in negligence law including vicarious liability, strict liability, professional malpractice and products liability.
- Identify the standards for professional malpractice and medical malpractice
- Describe the role of compliance officers and legal team in identifying and reducing the likelihood of tort liability in a business setting.
- Analyze products liability principles and case law.
- Discuss vicarious liability concepts and how this applies to hypothetical scenarios
- Explain worker's compensation concepts in relation to negligence

## **Evaluation of student learning:**

**Assignments:** Written research, case briefs or case analysis responses, legal document drafting assignments and practical legal tasks designed to assess preparedness for practical legal work.

**Quizzes:** Essay and multiple-choice assessments designed to measure understanding of objective legal concepts.

**Discussions**: Course-related conversations in a live setting or via discussion board to support and assess concepts presented in the unit.
