# TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

## CENTENARY COLLEGE

Centenary College Program: BA in Criminal Justice

AND

## MERCER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Mercer County Community College Programs: AS in Law Enforcement or Corrections

The intent of this agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer and transition of **Mercer County Community College** Associate in Science in Law Enforcement or Corrections graduates into **Centenary College** Criminal Justice Bachelor of Arts program. The agreed transferability of **Mercer County Community College** courses is effective with this signed agreement. This agreement is based upon the completion of the Associate in Science in either Law Enforcement or Corrections requirements and graduation from **Mercer County Community College**. Students transferring from the **Mercer County Community College** Associate in Science in either Law Enforcement or Corrections Degree Program will be accepted as juniors in the **Centenary College** Criminal Justice BA Degree Program. The total number of credits that may be transferred to **Centenary College** is 72. It is possible that a **Mercer County Community College** student may be able to transfer in credits in excess of those listed up to 72 credits if those courses meet **Centenary College** requirements. All credits transferred will count as credits toward the 128 credits required for graduation in the **Centenary College** Criminal Justice BA Degree Program. The final 32 credits of the Criminal Justice BA Degree Program must be taken at **Centenary College**, with a total of 128 credits including credits transferred to **Centenary College** and credits earned at **Centenary College**. **Mercer County Community College** Law Enforcement or Corrections AS Degree Program students who graduate with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher will transfer the courses listed on the course equivalency pages, providing the individual grades are "C" or better. This agreement will be in force at the start of the **Spring 2011** semester. Any changes to this agreement will require the submission of written amendments to be signed by both parties.

This agreement shall be in effect on a year-to-year basis until updated by mutual agreement or canceled by either party. Any student enrolled at **Centenary College** at the time of cancellation shall not be affected by the cancellation.

The total number of credits that may be transferred to Centenary College is 62/63. However, it is possible that a MCCC student will be able to transfer in credits in excess of those listed in the articulation agreement as Centenary's policy allows for a maximum of 72 credits in transfer from community colleges, but careful selection will be necessary to insure that the courses meet Centenary College requirements. Total 128 credit requirement for graduation.

It is recommended that all students take MTH 1111 Quantitative Literacy at Centenary College. However, a transfer student who has taken two math courses may use them to fulfill the math requirement for the Centenary College core. If only one math course has been taken, it may be applied to elective credit.
