DUAL ADMISSIONS PROGRAM AGREEMENT

MERCER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

NEW JERSEY CITY UNIVERSITY

I. Purpose and Goals

This program is designed to offer students a unique opportunity to complete a bachelor's degree "seamlessly" at two institutions of higher education. Under this agreement, Mercer County Community College (MCCC) students who complete an associate's degree and meet the requirements listed herein will be seamlessly admitted with full junior status into a corresponding Bachelor of Science degree program in the School of Business at New Jersey City University (NJCU). A student's entry into a Bachelor of Science degree specified under this Agreement is predicated upon conferral of an Associate in Science (A.S.) degree or Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree at MCCC as per the transfer articulation map(s) under APPENDIX A and APPENDIX B.

Students who participate in the Dual Admissions program will be initially identified by MCCC, which will provide notification to NJCU prior to the completion of the A.S. degree program or as early as during the first semester at MCCC. MCCC will monitor the academic progress of students covered by this Agreement. Students may decide at any point that they want to be part of the program. Even if a student decides to transfer to NJCU after completion of their A.S. degree, NJCU will accept their credits under the structure of this agreement.

Students who complete their A.S. program and fulfill all criteria of this Dual Admissions Program Agreement will enter NJCU as fully matriculated students with a minimum of 60 credits and junior-year standing as per the NJ Comprehensive State-Wide Transfer Agreement. The total number of credits may exceed 60 but no more than 90, depending upon the major(s) or areas of study

This program is also designed for students completing MCCC's A.A.S. degrees who are not participating in or eligible for the joint admissions program, as a regular admit student. Under this agreement students will enter into a sequential degree program wherein a Bachelor of Science degree in the specific business program at New Jersey City University is predicated upon conferral of an Associate in Applied Science degree at Mercer County College (See Section III for admission requirements). Students will be initially identified by MCCC, which will provide notification to NJCU prior to the completion of the A.A.S. degree program or as early as during the first semester at MCCC. MCCC will monitor the academic progress of students covered by this Agreement. Students may decide at any point that they want to be part of the program. Even if a student decides to transfer to NJCU after completion of their A.A.S. degree, NJCU will accept their credits under the structure of this agreement.

Students who complete the A.A.S. program and fulfill all criteria of this Articulation Program Agreement will enter NJCU as fully matriculated students, with the exact number of credits specified in the program-specific articulation map for A.A.S. graduates in APPENDIX B.

II. Benefits/Advantages of This Program

- Creation of a four-year plan for completing the Bachelor of Science degree;
- Provision of early planning with MCCC and NJCU faculty and advisors to ensure a smooth transfer;
- Ability to receive guidance from NJCU advisors while enrolled at MCCC;

- Prospective students will be offered admissions and financial aid advising through scheduled visits by NJCU staff to the MCCC campus;
- Ability to earn both associate's and bachelor's degrees while maximizing transferability of credits;
- A guarantee that students who meet the stated criteria will have a reserved place in a corresponding program at NJCU;
- Graduation requirements at NJCU will not change as long as the student meets the criteria outlined under **Section IV**. **Time Limits**;
- Access to NJCU financial aid counselors to facilitate early financial planning and estimates of financial aid and scholarships while students are enrolled at MCCC;
- An opportunity for students to meet with college administrators and faculty members at special advising and orientation programs;
- A welcome to NJCU with notification of a student's acceptance into the Dual Admissions Program;
- Access to events and facilities at the NJCU School of Business following successful completion of the Dual Admissions Program Application;

III. Requirements for Admission to NJCU

Admission to NJCU under this Agreement is contingent upon a student's:

- Admission to MCCC;
- Completion and submission of the Dual Admissions Program Application on the NJCU website; or in the case A.A.S. students, completion of an application to NJCU;
- Attainment of a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher in an A.S. or A.A.S. program at MCCC;
- Meeting the general admissions criteria of NJCU;
- Submission to NJCU of official transcripts from MCCC and any other college-level work from each institution attended.

IV. Time Limits

Students completing associate's degree course work at MCCC and matriculating at NJCU within four years of the student's first enrollment in a college-level course at MCCC will follow the undergraduate college degree requirements in place at NJCU at the time of initial enrollment in a college-level course at MCCC. If more than four years elapse between the date of initial enrollment in a college-level course at MCCC and the date of matriculation at NJCU, the student must fulfill the degree requirements in place at the time of entrance to NJCU.

V. Transferability of Credits

Dual Admissions Program students entering NJCU with an A.S. degree will receive credit for all NJCU general education requirements. Students who have earned an A.S. degree from MCCC and meet all criteria set forth in **Section III. Requirements for Admission to NJCU** will receive a minimum of 60 credits at NJCU toward the bachelor's degree. Any credits above 60, will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

Students entering NJCU with an A.A.S. degree under this articulation agreement will receive credit for NJCU general studies requirements on a course by course basis. NJCU will accept a maximum of 70 credits when the student enters the University with an A.A.S. degree.

Transfer of credits in excess of the 70 credits noted in the agreement will be evaluated on a case- by-

case basis and only as these credits apply to the specific business degree program at NJCU.

Students entering one of the business degree programs through this articulation agreement may not transfer into another NJCU major without a re-evaluation of his or her original transcript(s). This evaluation will be completed based on existing policy applied to all non-business A.A.S. transfer students. The A.A.S. degree programs are generally classified as terminal, vocational programs.

Students entering NJCU under this Agreement with an A.A.S. degree will receive credit for up to 70 credits according to the program-specific articulation map for A.A.S. graduates in APPENDIX B.

VI. Bachelor of Science Program Requirements

Requirements for each participating program are mapped and included in this Agreement under APPENDIX A and B. Programs may be added to this Agreement at any time by adding articulation maps to APPENDIX A or B and the subsequent signatures of all parties in **Section X. Approvals**.

VII. Institutional Responsibilities

- MCCC and NJCU agree to regularly promote the Dual Admissions Program and the A.A.S. articulation agreement in appropriate college publications and at recruitment and outreach activities.
- MCCC and NJCU will work collaboratively to support and effectively administer this articulation agreement in the best interest of students.
- A representative of NJCU will participate in related orientation and open house sessions at MCCC and meet with students in the Dual Admissions Program or in A.A.S. programs at MCCC as needed.
- Students accepted into the Dual Admissions Program or in approved A.A.S. degree programs will be invited and encouraged to attend NJCU's early scheduling/advisement sessions for new students.
- MCCC agrees to distribute information provided by NJCU to its graduates regarding the Bachelor of Science degree programs at the NJCU School of Business.

VIII. Agreement Review

NJCU and MCCC will notify one another of curricular changes upon institutional approval. The Dual Admissions Program Agreement shall be reviewed and modified, as needed, every three years by officials at NJCU and MCCC.

This agreement represents the entire agreement between NJCU and MCCC through their authorized agents and will be deemed fully executed on the date of the last signature. All negotiations, oral agreements, and understandings are merged herein and any change(s) in the terms must be made in writing and signed by all parties.

IX. Anticipated Date of Implementation

The terms of this Agreement become effective June 15, 2020.
