




Three Temperamental Groups (Thomas and Chess)

Group	
	Usually happy and cheerful Tended to adjust well to new situations Had regular routines for eating, sleeping, and toileting Tended to be easy to calm
<u>Difficult</u> (10%)	Tended not to adjust well to new situations Had irregular routines for eating, sleeping, and toileting Tended to withdraw from novel experiences Responded intensely
<u>Slow-to-warm-up</u>	Usually unhappy Tended not to adjust well to new situations Did not respond intensely to novel situations








Goodness of Fit

The degree to which an individual's temperament is compatible with the demands and expectations of his or her environment



Example

- If parents of difficult children are supportive and consistent, undesirable behaviors may become less severe
- If parents of difficult children are harsh, rejecting, or inconsistent, undesirable behaviors can worsen






















- feeding or contact comfort was more important to infant

Attachment was closely associated with critical periods in early life, after which it was difficult or _____






Preattachment Birth to 2 months
