In recognition of the 12th National Women and Girls HIV/AIDS Awareness Day (Saturday, March 10), the Hyacinth Aids Foundation will provide a presentation and offer FREE testing. Recent statistics show that:

- One in four people living with HIV in the United States is female.
- Only about half of women living with HIV are getting care.
- Only four in ten of them have the virus under control. Women face unique HIV risks and challenges that can prevent them from getting needed care and treatment. Addressing these issues remains critical to achieving an HIV- and AIDS-free generation.
