

## Mercer County Community College offers summer camps for kids 6-17

**WEST WINDSOR** — Families looking for enrichment and recreation this summer should look to Mercer County Community College. The college camp season for children, ages 6 to 17, begins on June 22. Camps take place on the college's West Windsor campus located at 1200 Old Trenton Road.

Camp College offers children, ages 6 to 12, an enriching alternative to traditional summer camp in two four-week sessions: June 22 to July 16 and July 20 to August 13.

Campers may choose from more than 60 subject areas and create an individualized schedule to match their interests. There are limited openings in Camp College's Specialty Camps for ages 6 through 16, which are offered in one-week sessions in a variety of specialty subjects including computer technology, culinary arts, the

sciences, arts and recreational activities.

Mercer's Sports Camps, for ages 7 to 17, offer weeklong instructional sessions in 10 popular sports: baseball, basket-

ball, field hockey, golf, in-line hockey, mountain biking, soccer, softball, tennis and speed/agility/quickness. Staff members include college and high school coaches, as well as college athletes from around the region. Camps begin June 22 and continue through August 14.

Tomato Patch Visual and Performing Arts Workshops offer students entering grades 5 through 12 a multidisciplinary experience in theater, dance, vocal music and visual arts. Each session concludes

with a performance and gallery exhibit. Session I, from June 22 to July 16 is open to students entering grades 8-12. Session II, from July 20 to

Aug. 6, is for students entering grades 5-7. Both programs conclude with a Festival of the Arts for family and friends featuring performances and an art exhibit.

An additional Master Class session from July 20 to Aug. 7 is offered for 8th to 12th graders who complete the first session.
