

## Generals joins brass at community college

WEST WINDSOR — Donald “Guy” Generals has been named vice president for academic affairs at Mercer County Community College, the college’s board of trustees announced.

Generals, who has 23 years of experience in higher education as an administrator and teacher, replaces Thomas N. Wilfrid, who retired late last year after a 38-year career at the college.

“Dr. Generals is a vibrant and experienced leader,” MCCC President Patricia C. Donohue said in a news release. “We are delighted that he will be joining us, and we will tap into his expertise in many areas, particularly in urban education, as we continue to seek ways to provide college access for all populations in our county.”

Generals holds a doctorate in social and philosophical foundations of education from Rutgers University, a master’s degree in urban education/community service and a bachelor’s degree in political science, both from William Paterson College.

To take up his new post at MCCC, Generals will leave his job as provost at the Katharine Gibbs School in Manhattan. Among his prior experience are three years as vice president for academic and student affairs at SUNY Rockland Community College and 16 years of administrative experience at Passaic County Community College.

Generals, in the college’s news release, said he accepted his position at Mercer “because of the college’s reputation as a dynamic institution.”

“I am from New Jersey and quite familiar with MCCC and its history,” he said. “I think the college’s future is quite bright and I really look forward to being part of it.”
