

Dual-Admission Program

Mercer County Community College and Jefferson School of Nursing

The dual-admission program between Mercer County Community College (MCCC) and Jefferson School of Nursing (JSN) at Thomas Jefferson University (TJU) provides a way for students to earn an associate degree in nursing (ADN) and a bachelor of science degree in nursing (BSN) in a seamless, integrated curriculum.

After completing the ADN program, students are awarded an associate degree in nursing from MCCC. After passing the NCLEX-RN examination, students continue to the RN-BSN program at TJU for the bachelor's degree coursework. A BSN degree is awarded by TJU after successful completion of that program, in as quickly as two semesters.

How do I apply?

- Submit an application for admission to TJU online at http://www.jefferson.edu/schools/apply.cfm.
- Forward all required documents to TJU, including an official transcript for the required prerequisites and a letter from MCCC offering admission to the ADN program.
- Provide a letter of recommendation from an academic advisor or other appropriate official of MCCC.
- It is recommended that students choose an entry term at least 3–6 months (but not more than two years) following graduation from MCCC to allow time to pass the NCLEX-RN examination and otherwise prepare.

What are the admissions requirements?

Students will be offered admission into the RN-BSN program at TJU if they:

- have earned 17 credits in specified prerequisite (see opposite page) coursework and have been admitted to the ADN program at MCCC.
- meet the admission criteria established by TJU. (Successful candidates typically have a cumulative grade-point average of at least 2.7.)
- Note that Graduates of MCCC's nursing program or any other diploma nursing or associate's program should apply to the traditional RN-BSN program and not the dual-admission program.

Once offered admission, when do I begin coursework at TJU?

- After completing the associate's degree program at MCCC.
- After completing and earning a grade of "C" or higher in the 27 credits of non-nursing courses required by TJU. (See the course sequence.)
- At least six months but not later than two years following graduation from MCCC.
- After passing the NCLEX-RN examination.

Prerequisite Courses for Admission to JSN

A grade of C or better is required in each prerequisite course.
