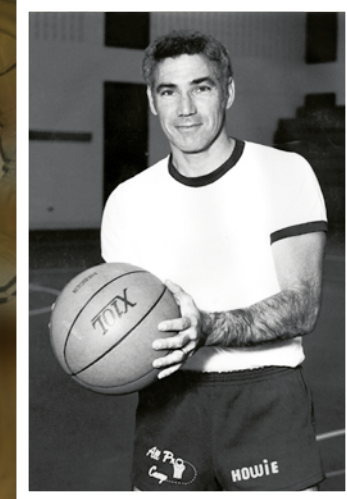

The Legendary Career of Howie Landa

With a total won-loss record of 555-152, Howie Landa coached at MCCC from 1962 to 1987. Landa first took the Vikings to the national tournament in Hutchinson, KS, in 1964, and again in 1968, advancing to the championship game before losing by two points. The 1972-73 team finally brought home the national title, with another title to follow in 1974. The Vikings played in two more finals in 1976 and 1979. Many of MCCC's players continued their basketball careers at four-year schools. Landa's teams earned 10 Regional Championships and 15 District Championships. He was named NJCAA Region 19 Coach of the Year 10 times and National Coach of the Year three times.

In addition to men's basketball, Landa mentored many women's players and also coached baseball and men's soccer. Most importantly, he was a professor and source of inspiration for hundreds of students.

Originally from Philadelphia, Landa had a stellar basketball career at Central High School and then played at Lebanon Valley College in the early 1950s, where he earned 16 individual records and led the Flying Dutchmen to the Middle Atlantic Conference title in 1953. He then played in the Eastern Pro League and was named All-League in 1957.

After his retirement from MCCC, Landa moved to Henderson, NV, where he became an assistant coach at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas (UNLV) under Jerry Tarkanian. From 1990-1994, he was an assistant coach for UNLV's women's basketball team. In 1994, Landa coached the men's team for seven games as interim coach, compiling a record of 5-2. He recently retired from teaching at UNLV. Landa is a member of the Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame.
