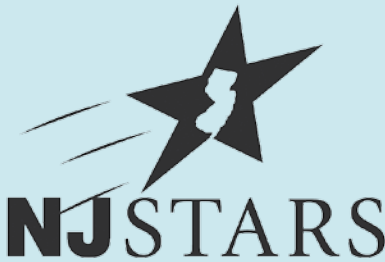

Placement Testing

Who Must Test

Unless exempt, the following students are required to take a FREE placement test: full-time students (12 or more credits), part-time students who wish to enroll in a course that will result in the accumulation of 12 credits or more, and all persons who wish to enroll in English or mathematics courses. The test does not affect your admission to the college, but the results help to place you in the appropriate courses. The test is self-paced and takes approximately two hours.

Exemptions from Testing

- A score of 500 or higher on the critical reading portion of the SAT test exempts you from the English portion of the placement test.
- A score of 500 or higher on the math portion of the SAT test exempts you from the math part of the placement test (and qualifies you for the college-level math placement test).
- An ACT score of 21 or higher.
- A degree from an accredited U.S. college or university (transcript evidence required).

- Evidence (college transcript) of college-level English or mathematics courses.
- Enrollment in ESL courses.

If you have documentation (i.e., SAT/ACT test scores and/or college transcripts) that will exempt you from the math and/or English sections of the placement test, call the Admissions office at (609) 570-3795.

If English is not your first language, call (609) 570-3244 to arrange for the English as a Second Language Test.

Arrangements for Testing

You can take the placement test *at any time* throughout the year.

Individualized testing is available through the Testing Centers of each campus. Please call (609) 570-3295 (WWC) or (609) 570-3151 (JKC) for details and arrangements.

Special accommodations for testing may be arranged through the Office of Special Services at (609) 570-3525.

Monthly Payment Plan

Students may apply online, over the telephone to Academic Management Services (AMS), or in-person at the MCCC Accounting Office for interest-free monthly payments.

Payment and Refund Policy

No later than the first day of the semester, students must drop any unpaid class(es). Thereafter, students are responsible for full payment for all classes that they have registered for. Students may apply for a full refund for a class through the first business day after the *initial meeting* of that class.
