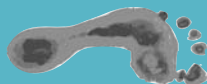

# Placement Testing

## Who Must Test

Unless exempt, the following students are required to take a FREE placement test: full-time students (12 or more credits), part-time students who wish to enroll in a course that will result in the accumulation of 12 credits or more, and all persons who wish to enroll in English or mathematics courses. The test does not affect your admission to the college, but the results help to place you in the appropriate courses. The test is self-paced and could take three hours.

## Exemptions from Testing

- A score of 540 or higher on the critical reading portion of the SAT test exempts you from the English portion of the placement test.
- A score of 530 or higher on the math portion of the SAT test exempts you from the math part of the placement test (and qualifies you for the college-level math placement test).
- A degree from an accredited U.S. college or university (transcript evidence required).
- Evidence (college transcript) of college-level English or mathematics courses.
- Enrollment in ESL courses.

If you have documentation (i.e., SAT test scores and/or college transcripts) that will exempt you from the math and/or English sections of the placement test, call the Admissions office at (609) 570-3795.

If English is not your first language, call (609) 570-3244 to arrange for the English as a Second Language Test.

## Arrangements for Testing

You can take the placement test *at any time* throughout the year.

Individualized testing is available through the Testing Centers of each campus. Please call (609) 570-3295 (WWC) or (609) 570-3151 (JKC) for details and arrangements.

Special accommodations for testing may be arranged through the Office of Special Services at (609) 570-3525.
