# GUARANTEED TRANSFER ADMISSION AND CORE-TO-CORE AGREEMENT 

Between
DELAWARE VALLEY UNIVERSITY
and
MERCER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

## Preface

Mercer County Community College (Mercer) and Delaware Valley University (DelVal) enter into this articulation agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from Mercer to DelVal and to expand their opportunities for academic success at DelVal. It consists of both a Guaranteed Transfer Admissions agreement for students in eligible programs and a Core-toCore agreement that applies to all Mercer A.A. and A.S. graduates.

## Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement:

The Guaranteed Transfer Admissions agreement facilitates the transfer of Mercer students who have completed the Mercer associate degree programs identified in this agreement into the corresponding degree programs at DelVal. Identified programs are listed in attached Table 1. Subject to the terms of this agreement, a student who completes the Associate degree at Mercer will be conditionally admitted* into a related Bachelor's degree program at DelVal and assured third year (junior) status.

The length of time required for a full-time student to complete the requirements for the Bachelor's degree varies by degree program. However, in general, a full-time student can complete most Bachelor's degree programs within four regular semesters, providing the student appropriately schedules and successfully completes (without repeating courses) his or her remaining courses at DelVal.
*Full admission will be granted after the submission of all required documents including, but not limited to, completed application, transcripts and portfolio (if required).

## Core-to-Core Agreement:

In addition, DelVal agrees to accept the General Education Core embedded in the Mercer Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees as meeting all the requirements of its undergraduate General Education requirements. This core-to-core agreement applies to all Mercer A.A., and A.S. graduates, and is not limited to students who participate in the Guaranteed Transfer Admissions agreement. Students who change their program of study may be required to take appropriate pre-requisite courses either at DelVal or at Mercer.

## Terms and Conditions Applicable to Both Agreements:

- Students must complete the DelVal Dual Admission Intent Form before completing 30 college-level credits. This includes credits earned from previous institutions.
- A minimum grade of " $\mathrm{C}-$ " is required to transfer a course to DelVal. All courses must be college-level.
- The minimum cumulative GPA required for admission to DelVal under this agreement is 2.0. However, each degree program may have different requirements.
- DelVal will accept a maximum of 78 credits in transfer from all prior colleges and universities.
- DelVal has a 48 credit residency requirement, 15 of these 48 credits must be in the major.
- Mercer credits earned through Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) will be evaluated on an individual basis according to established DelVal policies.
- The student must meet all applicable DelVal requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission and payment of tuition and fees.
- Students transferring under this agreement will be eligible for financial aid and housing on the same basis as native DelVal students.
- Once at DelVal, students who transfer under the terms of this agreement are responsible for meeting all degree requirements in effect for their major.
- DelVal will waive the application fee for students who apply to DelVal pursuant to this agreement.
- DelVal agrees to award academic scholarships to all qualified students admitted to DelVal pursuant to this Agreement.
- Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester) with a 3.5-4.0 final Mercer GPA will receive a $\$ 19,500$ scholarship.
- Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester) with a 3.0-3.49 final Mercer GPA will receive a minimum of $\$ 18,500$ scholarship.
- Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester) with a 2.5-2.99 final Mercer GPA will receive a minimum of $\$ 16,000$ scholarship.
- Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester) with a 2.0-2.49 final Mercer GPA will receive a minimum of $\$ 13,000$ scholarship.
- Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester) who are members of Phi Theta Kappa will receive a 1,000 PTK scholarship
- Part-time students (enrolled in 6 to 11 credits a semester) with a final Mercer GPA of 3.0 or higher will receive a minimum of a $\$ 1,500$ scholarship.

All scholarships may be renewed each year contingent upon the student remaining in good academic standing at DelVal.

- Students are also eligible for need-based financial aid and other types of financial aid. Mercer students admitted under the agreement will be provided with DelVal financial aid information and receive full consideration for DelVal financial aid upon matriculation at DelVal.
- Students who do not complete any associate degree at Mercer are not eligible under the terms of these agreements. They will not be granted automatic admission to DelVal and must apply for admission under the regular transfer admissions process.


## Additional Terms and Conditions for the Guaranteed Transfer Admission Agreement:

- Students who successfully complete the A.A. or A.S. degree at Mercer and the courses outlined on Table 1 will be admitted to DelVal, will enter with third year (junior) status and are assured transfer credit as indicated. Courses in degree programs not included in Table 1 will be evaluated by DelVal on a course-by-course basis.
- Students transferring to a related DelVal Bachelor's degree program from an eligible Mercer County Community College Associate degree program will transfer their entire Associate degree and may transfer additional applicable credits, up to a total of 78 credits. This includes credits from all prior colleges and universities.


## Additional Terms and Conditions for the Core-to-Core Agreement:

- This Core-to-Core Agreement applies to all Mercer A.A. and A.S. graduates, and is not limited to students who participate in the Guaranteed Transfer Admissions agreement.
- Students who transfer under the terms of this agreement must apply for admission to DelVal within one year of Mercer graduation.
- Mercer students who do not complete an eligible associate degree from the community college will not be granted automatic admission to DelVal and must apply for admission under the regular transfer admissions process.
- DelVal agrees to accept the General Education embedded in the Mercer Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees as meeting all the requirements of its undergraduate General Education requirements.
- Students who change their program of study may be required to take appropriate prerequisite courses either at DelVal or at Mercer.
- For Mercer students who do not graduate with an associate degree specified in attached Table 1, DelVal will determine appropriate transfer of credit on a course-bycourse basis.


## Joint Responsibilities for Maintenance of this Agreement

- Mercer and DelVal agree to maintain and distribute information about this agreement, and any changes relevant to it, to students, administrators, faculty, counselors, and advisors.
- Mercer and DelVal will assure that the appropriate personnel at their respective institutions are made aware of the agreement and any revisions thereto, and are encouraged to support it.
- Both institutions will encourage Mercer students to meet with representatives of DelVal to discuss issues related to admission, financial aid, and transfer of courses well in advance of their expected date of entry.
- Both institutions agree to maintain and share outcomes data and records of the Mercer County Community College students admitted into the program to the extent permitted by law.
- Administrators and faculty from each institution teaching in the programs for which this agreement has been developed will be encouraged to meet periodically to discuss issues of curriculum and student development.
- Mercer County Community College and Delaware Valley College will jointly develop and implement marketing efforts to attract students to the program. Both institutions agree to share their logos and provide direct links between DelVal and Mercer websites.


## Revision, Renewal and Termination of this Agreement

- The DelVal Associate Director for Transfer Admission and the Mercer Director, Transfer Services are responsible for identifying and communicating to each other changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this agreement.
- This agreement will be in effect as of the date of its signing. It will be reviewed annually by the parties, and will be renewed automatically until superseded by a new agreement or formally terminated in writing.
- Either party may initiate amendments to this agreement, including the addition of eligible programs, by submitting them in writing to the designated representative from DelVal or Mercer Director, Transfer Services. No amendments will be effective unless signed by the authorized agents of each institution. Whenever possible, DelVal will grandfather students who have followed the previous articulation document.
- Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice of at least one (1) year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to DelVal under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes.
