ENG 101 ("C" grade or higher required)

ENG 102 ("C" grade or higher required)

CMN 111 or CMN 112

Social Science

12

No more than six credits in any one Social Science discipline may be taken to fulfill this requirement.

Choices include: CMN 101, CMN 215, CRJ101, CRJ212, ECO103, ECO111, ECO112, EDU101, EDU102, EDU109, EDU120, EDU201, GEO101, GEO102, POL101, POL102, POL201, POL203, POL211, POL220, all PSY courses, SOC101, SOC102, SOC103, SOC104, SOC 113, SOC 132, SOC201, SOC203, SOC205, SOC209, SOC 214, SOC219; all WGS courses

Note: PSY 101 is a pre-requisite for all 200-level PSY; SOC 101 or SOC 102 is a pre-requisite for all 200-level SOC.

Historical Perspective

6

One of the two History courses must be HIS101, HIS102, HIS112 or HIS113.

The other course may be any HIS course.

Diversity and Global Perspective

3

Choices include: ART101, ART123, ART124, ART 126, ART 236, BUS230, BUS296, ENG213, ENG214, ENG221, ENG231, ENG232, ENG234, ENG 235, ENG 236, GEO101, GEO102, HIS109, HIS112, HIS113, HIS 206, HIS218, HIS221, HIS 231, HOS115, MUS155, MUS 156, POL201, POL211, PSY221, all REL courses, SOC209, SPA110.

NOTE: If students select a History, Humanities or Social Science course that also counts as a Diversity and Global Perspective, then these 3 credits can be used for a Gen Ed elective.

Humanities

9

Two courses must be English Literature (includes all ENG 200-level courses EXCEPT ENG215 and ENG218, Creative Writing). The third course may be Foreign Language, History, Literature, Philosophy, or Religious Studies.

Foreign Language

6

Choices include: ARB, FRE, GER, HUN, ITA, JPN, LAT, PLS, SPA.

The two courses must be taken in one language and in progressive sequence.

Mathematics

6-8

Two college-level MAT courses are required. MAT 108, 120, and 138 are recommended.

Natural Science and Technology

6-8

At least one of these two courses must be a General Education laboratory science (BIO, CHE, or PHY).

BIO 113, CHE 106, and PHY 111 are recommended. BIO100 and CHE100 are not general education courses.

The second course may be a lab science, a science without a lab (e.g., BIO114 and BIO115) or a Technology course.

Technology courses include: IST101, IST102, IST 103, and IST140.
