Grading Criteria:

An “A” level paper will receive 20-25 points:

The student successfully summarizes the article selected. In this review the student addresses the questions provided in the syllabus to fully detail the research methods used and conclusions of the study, the student explains the author’s hypothesis and if it was supported. The paper has less than two spelling errors and is grammatically correct, captures the essence of the article and is clearly written. The APA format is followed and the reference is properly cited.

A “B” level paper will receive 16-19 points:

The student follows the same procedure as above, and writes a clear and concise summary that captures the essence of the article. Paper lacks complete answers to provided questions. The paper is grammatically correct, and has more than 4 spelling errors. The student follows APA format and the reference is appropriately cited.

A “C” level paper will receive 11-15 points:

The student submits a paper that meets the requirements of the assignment. The student has done a satisfactory job with the assignment, but the paper is not as clearly written as an “A” or “B” level paper and/or may have cited the reference improperly. Questions not fully answered which limited to detailed information necessary for thorough review

A “D” level paper will receive 6-10 points:

Student did not provide detailed information as requested in questions provided. The article was concisely written and/or information not comprehended sufficiently. Poor grammar and/or grammatical errors. APA citation not provided or incorrect.

An “F” level paper will receive 0-5 points
