



## Nursing Education Program Outcomes

***Program Outcome: Licensure Examination***

***Goal: 80% of program graduates will pass NCLEX on their first attempt.***

After successful completion of nursing education program, all students are eligible to take the exam to obtain state licensure as a registered professional nurse. The exam is written and administered by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing and is referred to as NCLEX (National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses).
