

Nursing Education Program Outcomes

Program Outcome: Licensure Examination

Goal: 80% of program graduates will pass NCLEX on their first attempt.

After successful completion of nursing education program, all students are eligible to take the exam to obtain state licensure as a registered professional nurse. The exam is written and administered by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing and is referred to as NCLEX (National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses). Program Outcome: Program Completion

Goal: 30% of students who enroll in the nursing education will complete the four semesters of nursing coursework within four semesters (100% of program length).

The exit exam is representative of the learning throughout the program. The clinical evaluation tool is used to assess the student's demonstration of applied learning.
