

### **Determination of NRS 221 Grade:**

In order to receive a grade in NRS 221, these criteria must be satisfied:

- (A) The student must achieve "Met" as the final grade on the Clinical Laboratory Performance Evaluation for all clinical objectives.
- (B) The student must achieve a "satisfactory" in College Lab that will be incorporated into the final grade.
- (C) Tests must be taken as scheduled (including HESI exam). A grade of 75 or better should be maintained on all tests (accept HESI no grade is assigned however, a remediation plan will be initiated if a student does not meet the benchmark for the exam).
- (D) All required written assignments must be completed and submitted as per guidelines.
- (E) Students must achieve a 90% or greater on the medication calculation test to receive a passing grade for the course.

When all course criteria have been met, the student will be assigned a grade as outlined in Evaluation of Student Learning - Grading.

50% - Final cumulative 60 questions
