Pass/No Credit Policy

Purpose: To clarify the Nursing Education's program position on courses graded on a pass/no credit. As a response to the COVID-19 pandemic of Spring 2020, MCCC and other institutions have offered a pass/no credit option to students. For students studying at MCCC, the minimum grade to receive a pass under this revised grading scale is a C or 70%.

Procedure:

- 1. Pass/no credit will not be applied to any professional phase nursing coursework.
- 2. Students taking general education coursework may use the pass/no credit option offered by MCCC during Spring 2020 for all courses except BIO103, BIO104, and BIO201. These courses require a C+ grade or higher to be applied to the nursing program of study.
- 3. If a students take a course with a pass/no credit option at another institution, it will be accepted under the following conditions:
 - a. The academic institution where it was earned has clearly defined and published the letter grade equivalent for the "P" grade.
 - a. The letter grade equivalent for the "P" grade is equal to or higher than the minimum grade required by the Nursing Education program for that course.
- 4. To be eligible for acceptance into the professional phase of the Nursing Education program, applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.5, calculated from the first semester of coursework. If an applicant has a "P" grade listed on his/her transcript for one of the first semester courses, the "P" grade will entered as a C into the GPA calculation.
