New Jersey's new **Community College Opportunity Grant** provides "free tuition" for those whose household income does not exceed \$45,000. This funding will be awarded after all other federal, state, or institutional aid. (Funds will be deposited directly to the college.)

To QUALIFY, You MUST...

- ✓ Have a total household adjusted gross income not exceeding \$45,000.
- ✓ Not have a prior college degree.
- ✓ Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.fafsa.gov, including submission of all required documents.
- ✓ Enroll for at least 6 course credits (typically two classes) in a semester.
- ✓ Make satisfactory academic progress.
