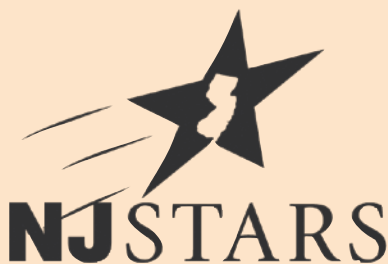

Placement Testing

WHO MUST TEST

Unless exempt, the following students are required to take a FREE placement test: full-time students (12 or more credits), part-time students who wish to enroll in a course that will result in the accumulation of 12 credits or more, and all persons who wish to enroll in English or mathematics courses. The test does not affect your admission to the college, but the results help to place you in the appropriate courses. The test is self-paced and takes approximately two hours.

EXEMPTIONS FROM TESTING

- A score of 500 or higher on the critical reading portion of the SAT test exempts you from the English portion of the placement test.
- A score of 500 or higher on the math portion of the SAT test exempts you from the math part of the placement test (and qualifies you for the college-level math placement test).
- An ACT score of 21 or higher.
- A degree from an accredited U.S. college or university (transcript evidence required).
- Evidence (college transcript) of college-level English or mathematics courses.
- Enrollment in ESL courses.

If you have documentation (i.e., SAT/ACT test scores and/or college transcripts) that will exempt you from the math and/or English sections of the placement test, call the Admissions office at (609) 570-3795.

If English is not your first language, call (609) 570-3244 to arrange for the English as a Second Language Test.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR TESTING

You can take the placement test *at any time* throughout the year.

Payment and Refund Policy

No later than the first day of the semester, students must drop any unpaid class(es). Thereafter, students are responsible for full payment for all classes that they have registered for. Students may apply for a full refund for a class through the first business day after the *initial meeting* of that class. There are no refunds other than full refunds, which are processed weekly every Tuesday in the form of a check mailed to the student. A course dropped anytime after refund eligibility for that course ends will be processed as a withdrawal, with no refund of tuition or fees.

Paying for Your Education

Community colleges charge the lowest tuition and fees of all higher education institutions. Mercer County Community College receives significant support from Mercer County and the State of New Jersey, but courses are not free. Students are required to pay for a portion of their education. To determine the cost of a course, consider tuition and college fees, special course fees, books and supplies.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition and college fees are calculated on a per-credit basis. The table on page 56 will help you determine how much you owe based upon the total number of credits you are taking and your residency. Besides regular tuition and college charges, some courses carry an additional fee. These are indicated in the Course Listings (pages 11-45).

Books and Supplies

Students must purchase their own textbooks and supplies. The Mercer Bookstore (see page 52 for hours and locations, or order online at www.mccc.bkstr.com) guarantees the availability of these for any course offered at MCCC. Costs range from \$1 to more than \$150, with the

average course costing \$100. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, credit card, and financial aid (checks not accepted).

Payment of Course Costs

Tuition and fees are due by Friday, July 17, 2009 for all Fall semester students who have registered by that date. After that date, payment is due when you register. You can pay by cash, check, money order, VISA, MasterCard or American Express. Payment can be made in person, by mail or at www.mccc.edu if you use a credit card. Questions about your bill should be directed to the Bursar's office at (609) 570-3499.

Financial Aid

Our financial aid staff will answer your questions and help you complete the forms. However, processing may take up to 60 days, so apply as early as possible — even before completing an application for admission.

You will be considered for all federal, state and MCCC financial aid if you complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**.
