Placement Testing

A placement test measuring English and mathematics skills is a requirement in the MCCC admissions process to determine student eligibility for certain courses and programs. The exam does not affect admission to the college. Completed in approximately two and a half hours, the test includes a timed essay followed by untimed multiple choice questions. Prospective students are encouraged to thoroughly review the sample essays and practice questions found in the placement testing section of the MCCC website.

EXEMPTIONS FROM TESTING

- 540 on the SAT critical reading exempts students from the English testing;
- 530 on the SAT mathematics exempts students from the basic math testing, but qualifies students for college-level math placement testing;
- 21 on Math ACT and 21 on English ACT exempts students from the English and basic math testing and qualifies students for the college-level math placement testing;
- A degree from an accredited U.S. college or university (transcript required);
- Evidence (college transcript) of college-level English or mathematics courses.

All documentation of scores and transcripts should be submitted to the Enrollment Services Office upon application to the college.

If English is not your first language, call 609-570-3438 to arrange for the English as a Second Language placement test.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR TESTING

Community Education and Training

The Community Education and Training department provides Adult Basic Education (ABE), General Educational Development (GED), and English as a Second Language (ESL) instructional activities to Mercer County residents. To enroll in classes, individuals must be at least 16 years of age and not enrolled in a public school.

To help students prepare for the GED examination, instruction in reading, writing, math, science, and social studies is available at the James Kerney campus. Additional instructional offerings focus on English language acquisition. Face-to-face instruction combined with individualized assignments is provided during morning and evening hours. On-site GED testing is also available.

The Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) or the Best Literacy assessment is used for placement and tracking student progress. Support services including tutoring, advising, and referrals to help students overcome barriers to learning are provided to assist students in meeting their educational goals. In addition, opportunities for career exploration and transitioning to post-secondary opportunities are available to help individuals prepare for 21st century jobs. English Language Institute (ELI)

Payment and Refund Policy

Prior to the start of any semester (or equivalent), a student can freely modify his or her schedule by adding and dropping classes without approval or penalty. Any monies paid by the student (tuition and fees) for a course dropped during this period will be refunded.

Once a semester begins, students must drop any class prior to the deadline specified below in order to be eligible for a refund for that class. There are no refunds other than full refunds, which are processed each Tuesday (after the start of classes) in the form of a check and mailed to the student.

Deadlines for refund eligibility differ according to class session length. A class must be dropped “no later than” the specified number of business days following the initial meeting day of that class:

- within 3 days ...for classes lasting more than 13 weeks
- within 2 days ...for classes lasting from 10 to 13 weeks
- within 1 day ...for all other classes

A course dropped anytime after refund eligibility for that course ends will be processed as a withdrawal, with **no refund of tuition or fees**. *Please be aware that dropped classes or withdrawals can cause adjustments to any financial aid awards, resulting in you having a balance due to the college for your tuition.*

No refund of tuition or fees will be made to a student who is withdrawn (WI) from a course by an instructor due to non-attendance or who is dismissed from the college for cause.

Library, Open Computer Lab

Libraries are located at both the West Windsor and James Kerney campuses. A small library is available at the Dempster Fire Training Center. Each contains print and non-print resources selected to meet your learning and resource needs. A web-based online catalog provides access to the collections. Paying for Your Education

Community colleges charge the lowest tuition and fees of all higher education institutions. Mercer County Community College receives significant support from Mercer County and the State of New Jersey, but courses are not free. Students are required to pay for a portion of their education. To determine the cost of a course, consider tuition and college fees, special course fees, books and supplies.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition and college fees are calculated on a per-credit basis. The table on page 57 will help you determine how much you owe based upon the total number of credits you are taking and your residency. Besides regular tuition and college charges, some courses carry an additional fee. These are indicated in the Course Listings (pages 11-46).

Books and Supplies

Students must purchase their own textbooks and supplies. The Mercer Bookstore (see page 56 for hours and locations, or order online at www.mccc.bkstr.com) guarantees the availability of these for any course offered at MCCC. Costs range from \$1 to more than \$150, with the average course costing \$100. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, credit card, and financial aid (checks not accepted).

Monthly Payment Plan

Students may apply online for interest-free monthly payments.

To Enroll:

Payments:

A \$50 non-refundable fee plus the first payment is due upon applying to Tuition Pay. Payments can be made by credit card, check, electronic check, or debit cards.

Payment of Course Costs

Tuition and fees are due by Friday, July 20, 2012 for all Fall semester students who have registered by that date. After that date, payment is due when you register. You can pay by cash, check, money order, VISA, MasterCard, American Express or Discover. Payment can be made in person, by mail or at www.mccc.edu if you use a credit card. Questions about your bill should be directed to the Bursar's office at (609) 570-3499 or 3159.

Financial Aid

You will be considered for federal, state and MCCC financial aid if you complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** at www.fafsa.gov.

Our financial aid staff will answer your questions and help you complete the forms. However, processing may take up to 60 days, so apply as early as possible — even before completing an application for admission.
