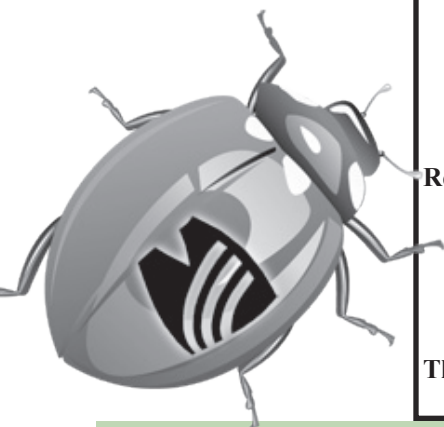

## Career Training Institute (CTI)

**CTI provides short-term skills training and job placement for adults 18 years and older who are seeking employment in high-demand occupations.**

CTI training areas include:

The Adult Basic Education (ABE) and General Educational Development (GED) programs provide an alternate way for adults to earn a New Jersey State GED diploma. Academic instruction is provided for individuals who are at least 16 years old and are not enrolled in a public school.

Instruction in reading, writing, math, science and social studies is available in English and Spanish at the James Kerney campus and extension sites in the community. # Placement Testing

A placement test measuring English and mathematics skills is a requirement in the MCCC admissions process to determine student eligibility for certain courses and programs. The exam does not affect admission to the college. Completed in approximately two and a half hours, the test includes a timed essay followed by untimed multiple choice questions. Prospective students are encouraged to thoroughly review the sample essays and practice questions found in the placement testing section of the MCCC website.

## EXEMPTIONS FROM TESTING

- 540 on the SAT critical reading exempts students from the English testing;
- 530 on the SAT mathematics exempts students from the basic math testing, but qualifies students for college-level math placement testing;
- 21 on Math ACT and 21 on English ACT exempts students from the English and basic math testing and qualifies students for the college-level math placement testing;
- A degree from an accredited U.S.

college or university (transcript required);

- Evidence (college transcript) of college-level English or mathematics courses.

All documentation of scores and transcripts should be submitted to the Enrollment Services Office upon application to the college.

If English is not your first language, call 609-570-3244 to arrange for the English as a Second Language placement test.

## ARRANGEMENTS FOR TESTING

After completing a college admissions application and obtaining a MCCC student I.D. number, students may arrange to take the placement test by contacting the preferred testing location: the Academic Testing Center at the West Windsor Campus (609-570-3295) or the Beverly A. ## Payment and Refund Policy

Prior to the start of any semester (or equivalent), a student can freely modify his or her schedule by adding and dropping classes without approval or penalty. Any monies paid by the student (tuition and fees) for a course dropped during this period will be refunded.

Once a semester begins, students must drop any class prior to the deadline specified below in order to be eligible for a refund for that class. There are no refunds other than full refunds, which are processed each Monday in the form of a check and mailed to the student.

**Deadlines for refund eligibility** differ according to class session length. A class must be dropped "no later than" the specified number of business days following the initial meeting day of that class:

- within 3 days ...for classes lasting more than 13 weeks
- within 2 days ...for classes lasting from 10 to 13 weeks
- within 1 day ...for all other classes

A course dropped anytime after refund eligibility for that course ends will be processed as a withdrawal, with **no refund of tuition or fees**. *Please be aware that dropped classes or withdrawals can cause adjustments to any financial aid awards, resulting in you having a balance due to the college for your tuition.*

**No refund of tuition or fees** will be made to a student who is withdrawn (WI) from a course by an instructor due to non-attendance or who is dismissed from the college for cause.

# Paying for Your Education

Community colleges charge the lowest tuition and fees of all higher education institutions. Mercer County Community College receives significant support from Mercer County and the State of New Jersey, but courses are not free. Students are required to pay for a portion of their education. To determine the cost of a course, consider tuition and college fees, special course fees, books and supplies.

## Tuition and Fees

Tuition and college fees are calculated on a per-credit basis. The table on page 60 will help you determine how much you owe based upon the total number of credits you are taking and your residency. Besides regular tuition and college charges, some courses carry an additional fee. These are indicated in the Course Listings (pages 11-47).

## Books and Supplies

Students must purchase their own textbooks and supplies. The Mercer Bookstore (see page 54 for hours and locations, or order online at [www.mccc.bkstr.com](http://www.mccc.bkstr.com)) guarantees the availability of these for any course offered at MCCC. Costs range from \$1 to more than \$150, with the average course costing \$100. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, credit card, and financial aid (checks not accepted).

## Payment of Course Costs

Tuition and fees are due by Friday, December 10, 2010 for all Spring semester students who have registered by that date. After that date, payment is due when you register. ## Financial Aid

Our financial aid staff will answer your questions and help you complete the forms. However, processing may take up to 60 days, so apply as early as possible — even before completing an application for admission.

You will be considered for all federal, state and MCCC financial aid if you complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**.
