#### ISRAELI COUNTER-TERROR METHODS and HIGH RISK ENTRY

## Israeli Immediate Rapid Deployment & High Risk Search

**Location:** Israeli Krav Maga U.S. Training Center, 127 Hwy. 206, Hamilton, NJ 08610

Course Description: This (dry-fire) course will teach law enforcement officers the necessary knowledge, skills, and tactics for immediate rapid deployment against an active shooter along with high risk entry, search, and seizure tactics. Taught by Israeli Special Forces Instructor, N., this course is based on the standards of the IDF Counter-Terror Academy which certifies all CT and HRT units in Israel. Some of the topics covered include: counter-terror/instinctive shooting principals, differences between engaging a criminal and a terrorist, controlling and dominating a violent combat engagement, threat identification under stress, engaging an armed terrorist in a crowded environment, CT immediate rapid deployment tactics conducive to civilian populated locations such as schools, shopping malls, and airports, building and room entry, searching, clearing, and take-over tactics for one, two, three, and four man response, active shooter response involving hostages. Also covered is warrant execution against a terrorist or criminal including the specific Israeli search method used to locate, isolate, and extract a violent terrorist/felon. N.'s credentials also include teaching at the Sig Sauer Academy. N. was recently featured on the cover of Special Operations Report.

Required: duty holster/service gun (with two empty mags.), long-gun/SMG (with two empty mags) and sling, knee pads, & tactical oriented comfortable dress

### Israeli Counter-Terror Course Outline

## Immediate Rapid Deployment for an Active Terror Attack:

This half-day course will teach law enforcement officers the necessary knowledge, skills, and tactics to effectively respond to an active terror attack situation in an urban environment. Taught by current serving Israeli Special Forces instructor, N., this course is based on the standards of the Israeli Defense Force Counter-Terror School which certifies all Counter-Terror and Hostage Rescue units in Israel. Some of the topics covered in this course include: the differences between engaging a criminal and a terrorist, controlling and dominating a violent combat engagement, threat identification under stress, engaging an armed terrorist in a crowded environment, CT immediate rapid deployment tactics conducive to civilian populated locations such as schools, shopping malls, and airports, building and room entry, searching, clearing, and take-over tactics for one, two, three, and four man response, active shooter response involving hostages. This system is also effectively applicable to any active shooter situation.

### High-Risk Arrest and Secure Search:

This half-day course focuses on the subject of effectively conducting a high-risk arrest of a wanted or suspected terrorist in a neutral or hostile environment. Many operational casualties in Israel have been sustained by Special Unit operatives during attempted arrests of suicidal terrorists or searches of booby trapped terror cell strongholds. As a result, the method of Secure Search was developed to allow forces to effectively conduct high-risk raids and arrests while maximizing the security and safety of the arrest force. Some of the topics covered in this course include:

- > the difference between a high-risk arrest operation for a criminal and terrorist
- > the dangers posed by the terrorist/high-risk criminal who is prepared for an encounter with Law Enforcement and is determined to carry out his mission
- > terrorist tactics and tools used to prevent an arrest and cause casualties to the arrest force
- > planning a high-risk arrest operation in a neutral and hostile environment
- Secure Search of a building known or suspected to contain a terror ambush
