Eddie S. Glaude, Jr. is currently the Chair of the Department for African American Studies and the William S. Tod Professor of Religion and African American Studies at Princeton University. Widely regarded as one of the most important black intellectuals in the United States today, Glaude offers a critical and insightful view on the problems currently facing black America as well as the nation at large. He is the author of *Exodus: Religion, Race, and Nation in Early 19th Century Black America* (Chicago, 2000), winner of the William Sanders Scarborough Book Prize, *In a Shade of Blue: Pragmatism and the Politics of Black America* (Chicago, 2007), and *African American Religion: A Very Short Introduction* (Oxford, 2014). He is the editor of *Is it Nation Time? Contemporary Essays on Black Power and Black Nationalism* (Chicago, 2002) and co-editor with Cornel West of *African American Religious Thought: An Anthology* (Westminster John Knox, 2003). His award-winning book, *In a Shade of Blue: Pragmatism and the Politics of Black America*, has been characterized as a tour de force.
