Wednesday, August 21st, 2013

The Instructional and Professional Improvement Committee (IPIC) of Mercer County Community College is proud to announce a conference dedicated to teaching and learning. We are seeking proposals for presentations that will share innovative methods for engaging students in the learning process and supporting active learning.

Sessions may include, but are not limited to: teaching strategies for various learning environments (e.g., traditional, web-enhanced, online, hybrid, flipped), research presentations, simulations of technologies, techniques to support various learners (e.g., special needs students, limited English proficiency), or creative uses of social media. Presenters may select a 50 or 75 minute time slot. Please submit your proposal for one of the three tracks: Engaged Learning, Online Learning, or Problem-Based Learning (see track descriptions below).

The deadline for submissions is March 25th, 2013. The registration fee will be waived for MCCC faculty. Accepted presenters will be notified by early April.

Engaged Learning Track

Topics and examples supporting the theory that students learn best when they are active agents throughout the learning process.

Online Learning Track

Presentations focusing on online instruction with emphasis on active learning.

Problem-Based Learning Track

Topics and examples of this student-centered pedagogy where learning occurs through problem-solving and experiences.
